PEACE IN OUR TIME

“Blessed are the peacemakers, for they shall be called sons of God.” –Matthew 5:9

In December, the Associated Press took a poll to find the Top Ten News Stories of 2016. Some the items that made their list were: The U.S. Presidential Election, Police Attacks on Blacks, Attacks on Police Officers, and the war in Syria. During the Christmas season, we join the angels singing: “Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace...” but these news stories seem to proclaim anything but peace.

These stories show the strife that is out in our world but what about the discord in our own lives as well? Are there relationships in your life that are strained, stretched, or just plain broken? Is there a sliver of a disagreement that has gone unresolved for so long it has grown into a full-blown sore subject that can never be touched? Are there divisions among your family and friends that are just avoided rather than addressed? If you’re like me (and I believe that you are), then there’s not as much peace in your life as you would like.

There is hope. The whole purpose of Christmas is to address hard problems. When God had a problem with humanity, He came to earth to deal with it face-to-face in Jesus Christ to address it and ultimately to fix it but not necessarily to take it away. Peace is not the absence of conflict; peace is the active faith in Jesus Christ in the midst of conflict. Biblical peace creates a Christ-centered righteousness that brings people together in love. God’s peace is not the absence of a negative; it is a positive presence while life happens around us.

In January, we’re going to explore how a working faith in Jesus Christ while conflicts rage around us. I’m calling it: “Peace in our Time” and I’ll outline how the Bible teaches us to activate our faith in times of disagreement. Here’s what we’ll talk about:

January 8: “Blessed are the Peacemakers”—The Call to be Ambassadors of Christ

January 15: “When Your Peace is Stolen”—For the Offended

January 22: “When You’re to Blame”—For the Offenders

January 29: “Called Out of Conflict”—Christ Makes Us Like Him

You and I have been adopted as sons and daughters of our loving God in Holy Baptism. We have been given the ministry of reconciliation in our world as ambassadors of Christ. I hope you will join us in January as we learn how to conduct this necessary ministry to the world.

We have been going through his many studies over the years and I truly believe he gets better and more passionate the more he produces. This is #14 in his That the World May Know Series. This study just came out this past summer and is entitled, The Mission of Jesus. The sub-title is: Triumph of God's Kingdom in a World of Chaos. This is a 5 week study covering the following topics:

Capernaum: Jesus Binds the Evil One

Decapolis: The Other Side-Jesus and the Man From the Tombs

Crucifixion: The Coronation of a King

Ascension: The King Takes His Throne

Pentecost: God Changed His Address

All these topics lead nicely into our Lent season.

I am going to be leading the class on Wednesday nights beginning January 4th through February 1st at 6:30 p.m. The class will last approximately 1¹/₂ hours depending on discussion.

ELDEN KELLY



Elden Kelly is an improviser, band leader, guitarist, composer and singer-songwriter. He is known for a type of classically-influenced jazz and world music. Of a live performance, reviewer Lawrence Cosentino wrote, "He meandered from the Ganges to Delta blues, bluegrass, flamenco and a folk idiom so heartfelt it bordered on the devotional." After graduating from Boston's prestigious New England Conservatory of Music with a degree in Contemporary Improvisation in 2008, Elden accepted a full scholarship and teaching assistantship at Michigan State with Rodney Whitaker, earning a graduate degree in 2011 in Ethnomusicology.

Kelly is an active educator. He serves as adjunct professor of music at Jackson College, faculty at Jackson Symphony Orchestra Community Music School, private instructor to over 30 students, and also regularly teaches workshops at Elderly music. He has served as a guest lecturer in guitar at Western Michigan University and as a teaching assistant at Michigan State University Jazz Studies program and joins the Kalamazoo College Music department as guitar instructor this academic year.

In addition to nylon string guitar, Kelly is known for his work on the Glissentar, an 11-string fretless guitar which conjures up sounds reminiscent of India, Africa and the Middle East, or "Indo-Turkish bluegrass."

Kelly's recorded offerings are just beginning to showcase the scope and diversity of his ability. His 2007 release with vocalist Le Zhang, *Dreams of Yesterday* features a mix of jazz, and Chinese folk songs. His follow-up CD, *1000 Doors* is a compilation of original music settings for solo voice and guitar of the sacred writings of the Baha'i Faith. His 2010 Solo EP, is a collection of his original songs and instrumentals. January 2013 saw the release of his newest recording, *Solo Sessions, Volume 1*, a contemplative instrumental guitar album that highlights Kelly's ability to blur the line between composition and improvisation. He has also been featured on dozens of albums as a collaborative artist. Kelly has recently recorded with Paul Simon's bassist Bakithi Kumalo ("You Can Call Me Al") and percussionist Jamey Haddad as a session guitarist on the album "Love is Awake" that reached #1 on the iTunes World Music charts.
