I spent about 45 minutes one Tuesday afternoon on a raft in the middle of Lake Okoboji. It was swim time at Youth Week and there were a few campers splashing around. So, I decided to hold an impromptu Belly Flop Contest. For the huge cash prize of \$1, camper after camper would purposefully land on his (or her) stomach, hoping to be judged as the "best" belly-flopper. Forget what on-lookers would say or how their mid-sections would feel in the morning; it was all about the buck. When they emerged from the water, their faces told of the pain that they had just gone through for a dollar.

Some didn't want that kind of pain, so I taught them to do back flips. We had a couple of people who had never done one but with a little bit of coaching, they were flipping like pros in just a few minutes. My constant tag line for this was: "Not only will you leave camp knowing Jesus but you can also do a back flip." It was really cool to see the look on a camper's face when they came back up from the surface. No matter how the rest of the world perceived the back flip, there was a smile on the flipper's face as he or she came up and heard the applause from the on-lookers. It was the unmistakable mark of one who had just exorcised their inner demons and done something that fear had kept them from doing. The smiles all said one thing: victory!

In life, so many of us are willing to endure a lot of pain for a small reward. For some, they are willing to wreck a long-term relationship for a short-lived affair. Others are willing to endanger our lives for a quick fix, whether it be money or just the thrill of getting away with something. Many times, we take huge risks for something that won't last a year. Just as I was amazed at all the people willing to endure the pain of a belly flop for a measly buck, I am often amazed at other types of pain that people will endure for a reward that doesn't last.

But, sometimes the risk is worth the reward. To learn a new skill can be scary...really scary and life-changing. To meet a new person, to take a new position, to change careers or leave a place that feels like home, all of these things can make the best of us seize up in fear at wondering what will happen next. Before we know it, we feel like we're 13 again, standing on the edge of a dock, about to flip our heels over our head and come within mere inches of certain injury or worse, embarrassment.

But all of this is kid-stuff, right? There's a reason we do this stuff when we're younger: we don't know any better. Or at least that's the lie that we tell ourselves. We like to tell ourselves that we're too old to play around with learning new things or trying new experiences. We're set in our ways. Our bodies can't do what they used to. And, sometimes, there's some truth to that. Yet, I can't help but wonder do we stop playing because we grow old or do we grow old because we stop playing?

What would you do if no one was watching? What's stopping you?

TRUSTEES REPORT

At the June meeting, a report from Consumers Energy was discussed, as it showed a significant increase year over year. Dave Biergans noticed on a Saturday that the building was too cool for being unoccupied. Dave will be contacting Consumers Energy about the report and the Trustees are investigating upgrading the thermostats to better regulate the temperatures for energy efficiency.

The Trustees also took up a discussion again about getting a maintenance program without HVAC contractor to keep the heating and cooling systems working well and efficiently. Bill Soule is following up on this proposal.

Stan Chubb will be contacting a contractor about restoring power to the light pole at the Daycare end of the building that was damaged during the construction of the newer garage. This should tie back into the garage and be activated by light sensor. The timer for the parking lot lights will also be replaced.

Other maintenance projects are underway regarding the lights for the sign and rerouting a drain away from the Daycare play area. Follow up with our vendors about removing the old concrete pole base and the gym floor continue.

Bill Soule will continue to patch holes in the parking lot.

The next meeting is July 11th at 7:00 p.m.
