GIVING IT UP

"What are you giving up for Lent?" This is a question that I've heard echoing around all of Christendom each year. People will fill Facebook and Twitter with farewells on the day before Ash Wednesday. "So long, chocolate... I'll miss you, soda pop... How will I live without McDonald's?" Some will go for the big things: television, beer, and Facebook itself are all popular "fasts" in our time.

Most people see the fasting of Lent as giving up a good thing to remember the suffering and sacrifice of our Savior, Jesus Christ. Putting these things down is meant to be akin to Jesus laying down His life for us so that we can pick them up again in Easter, just as Jesus took up His life again and was gloriously resurrected from the dead.

But doesn't it seem just a bit shallow to equate the sweetness of chocolate to the sheer joy of the salvation that is given to us by Christ's death and resurrection? What if we could give up something else... something more meaningful... something that would help us to be people of faith and joy? What if we gave up things that prepared us to be "Easter people," that is, people who are renewed and brought back to life?

Let's give it a try. This Lenten season our theme will be <u>Giving It Up</u> and we'll focus on many things that Jesus wants us to give up as we prepare to be Easter people. Here's what we'll give up this year in Lent:

Giving Up Control: God wants us to deny ourselves and give him the final say when we are charting the course of our lives.

Giving Up Expectations: God doesn't guarantee any future circumstances but He does guarantee to be with us no matter the circumstances.

Giving Up Superiority: If we let go of our status symbols and judgmental attitudes, we can hear Jesus' call more clearly and respond more faithfully.

Giving Up Skepticism: There are some things that God wants to take on faith, even if we don't understand how or why it's true.

Giving Up Our Lives: We are used to thinking of life in terms of fixed beginnings and ends, but God has a larger vision of eternal life that begins here and now.

Giving Up Popularity: If we put our faith in the opinions of others, we will be disappointed. But if we put our trust in God's unending love, we will never be disappointed.

May God bless us all as we begin our annual pilgrimage to the cross and empty tomb of our Savior, Jesus Christ.

A NOTE FROM THE PLANNED GIVING BOARD

The Planned Giving Board (PGB) held its first meeting for 2017 on February 13th and was presented with one grant request. In support of the Care Bag Service Project (aka "Blessing Bags") initiated by the Messiah Youth, a \$1,000.00 Grant was awarded to them for the purpose of buying food, simple hygiene items, basic first-aid supplies, water, socks and other personal care items included in the bags. The Youth plan to continue assembling the bags, maintaining a supply on hand and available to Messiah members to keep in their cars for gifting to the homeless and persons in need in our community.

Messiah's Endowment Fund is designed to provide long-lasting support in following Messiah's mission to "Seek the Lost, Grow the Found". Through the use of our grant process, distributions up to 10% of the year-end balance over the previous twelve months can be available for distribution from our endowment fund. This year the fund has approximately \$16,200.00 available for grant requests. The fund is in place to receive gifts and address a variety of future needs, beyond what our annual budget is designed to provide.
