Church Service

What comes to mind when you see the words “Church Service”? I’ll bet you imagine the inside of our Sanctuary at Messiah. You see the altar, the cross, and your family in Christ. You probably see “your pew,” the place where you have sat for years. You can hear the sound of familiar hymns or praises songs being sung. You can feel the padded seats and the warm hands sharing the peace in the middle of worship. All of these images center around one key activity: worship.

The German word coined by Luther and others for this is Gottesdienst and, literally translated, it means “Service of God.” Let us now ask that most Lutheran of questions: “What does this mean?” What does it mean when we talk about worship more accurately as the “Service of God?”

The most important way for us to think of it is as “God’s service to us.” God is the subject of the service; He’s the one doing the service. This is most important because this is where our relationship with God has always begun and will always begin. God served us by creating this world and all that is in it. He served the people of Israel as He parted the Red Sea for them to escape Pharaoh. He served us by taking on our human flesh and living the perfect sinless life that none of us could. He served us by dying on the cross for us. He continues to serve us through the words of Absolution, through the waters of Holy Baptism, and through the Real Presence of the Lord’s Supper. As we enter the Sanctuary for every worship service, our question should always be, “What does God want to do for me today? What gifts does He have to share?”

But there is another way to think about this phrase, “Service of God.” There is the sense where God is the object of the service, that is, He receives our service. There is certainly an element of this in our worship. We sing hymns and songs in praise to God, emulating the angels who constantly praise Him. We give offerings to Him so that He can continue to do His work of proclaiming the Gospel at Messiah and in our corner of the world. Most of our activities at Messiah are considered a service to Him: the ladies who prepare the altar for worship, the dedicated Kingdom Quest teachers, and the ones who faithfully mow the lawn. All of these may be considered serving God in this place. These are all good, worthy and important things. I’m not diminishing them with what I’m about to say next. But this is not where God asks us to serve.

When Jesus sums up the Law of God, His divine will, He says, “You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind. This is the great and first commandment. And a second is like it: You shall love your neighbor as yourself. On these two commandments depend all the Law and the Prophets.” (Matthew 22:37-40) If we ask ourselves “What does God want to give to me today?” as we walk in the Sanctuary, then the question that we must ask ourselves as we walk out is this: “With whom does God want me to share these good gifts?” This is what it means for us to love our neighbors as ourselves. We give them the same things that we cherish about our Divine Service. To love our neighbors as ourselves goes hand-in-hand with the Fifth Petition of the Lord’s Prayer: Forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us. The same forgiveness that we have received is what we use to love our neighbor as ourselves. This is how the Church truly serves her Lord. This is also the Service of God.

Which leads us to a whole new concept of “Church Service.” It’s not just the hour-or-so that is spent on Sunday morning at 5740 Holt Road in Holt. It’s taking the good gifts that we have received at that place and using those gifts of God to define how we interact with our neighbors. It’s forgiving them, just as we have been forgiven by the Father through Christ Jesus. It’s valuing them, just as we are valued by the Father because of Christ Jesus. It’s loving them, just as we are loved by the Father because of Christ Jesus. This is how the Church serves the world. May She always serve this way!
